Dear Friends,

He will be so missed but we can rejoice for the people of Saint Lawrence Parish in Sayville where Our Lord now calls our brother to share his gifts and talents. Our prayers and best wishes go with him always.

Next Sunday at the 10:30 Mass, we will celebrate Father Brian's time with us followed by refreshments on the lawn behind the convent. I hope you can join us to give thanks to God for all that has been, to have some time to greet Father Brian personally and to pray for all that God has in store for this gifted man, Christian, and priest.

RESPECT LIFE COMMITTEE

From the Bishops of New York State (2008):

"Marriage always has been, is now and always will be a union of one man and one woman in an enduring bond. This is consistent with natural law, and should be obvious to all, no matter what their religion, or even if they have no religion at all. ... To be clear, the state's historic recognition of marriage is based on the biological fact that the physical union of a man and a woman tends to lead to children."

The Church's Teaching on Life: "Public authority ... can never presume to legitimize as a right of individuals -- even if they are the majority of the members of society -- an offense against other persons caused by the disregard of so fundamental a right as the right to life. The legal toleration of abortion or euthanasia can in no way claim to be based on respect for the conscience of others, precisely because society has the right and the duty to protect itself against the abuses which can occur in the name of conscience and under the pretext of freedom." (John Paul II, *Evangelium Vitae*, para. 71)

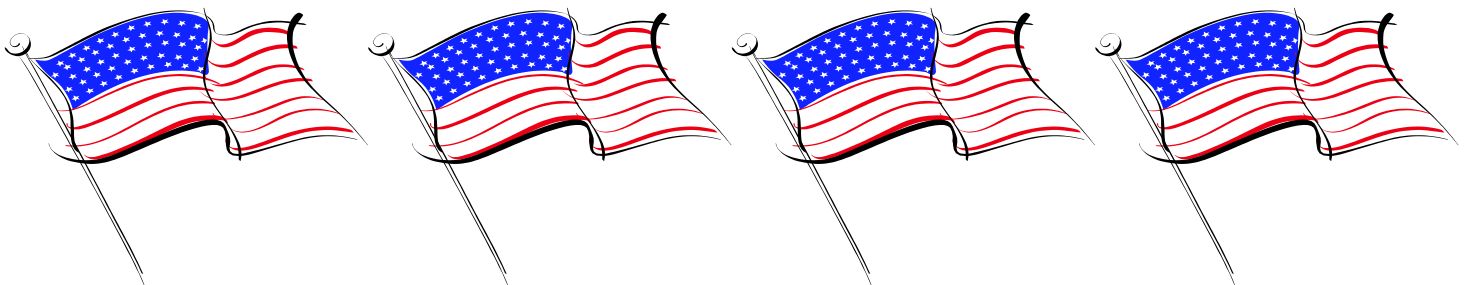
