How You Can Help:

The so-called "Reproductive Health Act" was introduced in the state Assembly on June 17, matching a bill already in the Senate, which is actively supported by the Governor. Because the bill declares that the state "may not discriminate" against the exercise of abortion in providing "benefits, facilities, services or information," it could compel every institution licensed or funded by the state, including religious hospitals, to allow abortions. There is not much time left in the 2009-2010 regular legislative session -- now is the time to express your opposition to this bill! Take action now by going to nyscatholic.org and sending the prewritten, editable message to your legislators.

Our community is very actively involved in sports for our children. While these are wonderful experiences, participation in our Music Ministry is also a great way to assist our young people in their continuing formation as the adults of tomorrow.

Since our inception, our Choir Members have been accepted to the finest Universities and Conservatories in the country. Of course, the students need a fine academic record, but when one looks at their activities, accomplishment in music is an effective way of enhancing the strength of their applications to college.

For members of the Boys Choir and Girls Choir, a long-term experience with our choir has been helpful in assisting them to attend Dartmouth, Stanford, Julliard, Manhattan School of Music, Westminster Choir College (Princeton) and a great number of fine learning institutions. In addition they have received a great number of financial grants for community service and for essays they have written in acknowledgement of their experiences in Choir.

So, while serving their parish community, and growing closer to their faith through music, they are also expanding their future educational opportunities.

We require much less of a commitment than most sport activities do, and our singers do learn a love of music and church.
